

ECOSTORE

Products like Ecostore's boat wash are designed to remove salt and grime from all hard and soft surfaces. However, its plant and mineral-based formula rapidly biodegrades in marine environments, making it safer for the boating community and safer for our oceans. CANO WATER

Plastic waste makes up the majority of marine debris, and single-use plastic water bottles constitute a large part of this. Conversely, aluminium is widely recycled across the UK, it is infinitely recyclable and 75% of all aluminium ever produced is still in use. Always buy products that are sustainably packaged when there is the option to do so, and be sure to recycle. Using water from the Austrian Alps and created from at least 50% recycled content, CanO water can be purchased online and resealed for repeated use aboard your vessel. WASHDOWN

When out on the water, consider your long-lasting impact on the marine environment. MESH BAGS

REUSABLE WATER BOTTLES

As part of your preparation for a trip out to sea, don't forget to fill up and pack reusable bottles with your favourite drinks – did you know bottles like this can keep your drinks both hot and cold? Responsible and sustainable use of the ocean is imperative for all boaters if we are to protect marine species and their habitats for future generations.

REUSABLE STRAWS

An estimated 8 million tons of plastic enter the oceans each year, primarily through major rivers. Plastic straws are especially harmful, frequently ending up in waterways, contributing to ocean pollution, and posing a direct threat to marine life, which often ingests them and dies. Refuse to use plastic straws, there's no reason to continue using them!
