As part of the relationship with the marine research-focused nonprofit, SeaKeepers, scientists will maintain an onsite presence at the development's property in the Ocean-side town of Golfito, Costa Rica

MIAMI, FL (January 15, 2016) - The facilitation and subsequent support of pivotal marine biology research is being buoyed in Costa Rica by a unique partnership that's unfolding along the country's Southern Pacific Coast.

Their studies will include a range of endeavors, including the sampling of small marine species, the sequencing of DNA genomes, and to determine what key findings can be gleaned for pharmaceutical needs.
