



EXPEDITION PROFILE

August 4th aboard DISCOVERY Yacht *Shredder*

The International SeaKeepers Society presented to campers at the Miami Seaquarium about the organization and its mission. Campers learned about the different expeditions supported by DISCOVERY Yachts and then were given a tour of D/Y *Shredder*.

During summer camp, the Miami Seaquarium invites local environmental organizations and initiatives to present on their mission and activities. SeaKeepers spoke to a group of 50 campers, ages 6-10, about our collaborations with vessels and various research institutions. The presentation included information about what marine scientists do, why vessels are important for supporting marine research, and showed videos from some of the expeditions completed by DISCOVERY Yachts.

After the presentation, the campers received a tour of D/Y *Shredder*. The captain and crew member showed the children around the interior of the vessel, explained nautical terminology, and talked about navigating the vessel. Interested campers were able to sit in the captain's chair to better understand how the vessel is controlled.

This marks the first time that SeaKeepers has collaborated with the Miami Seaquarium.
