seakeepers We are excited to announce our new partnership with The Nippon Foundation-GEBCO Seabed2030 Project!

Seabed2030 is a collaborative project to inspire the complete mapping of the world's ocean by 2030. SeaKeepers anticipates involving privately-owned vessels to participate in increasing our knowledge of the ocean by sharing depth measurements from navigation instruments while out at sea. Yachts have the opportunity to explore the world's oceans in areas where data is sparse, non-existent, or of poor quality. These are exactly the places where the contribution of global seafloor mapping efforts can have the greatest impact.

seakeepers Can you guess the distance a mako shark can swim in a month? The answer will have you saying "holy mackerel!"

Mako sharks belong to the mackerel shark family and are known to be the fastest sharks on earth, reaching short bursts of up to 80 miles an hour! In a single month, they can travel over 1,242 miles!

They grow twice as fast as most shark species, reaching a maximum length of 14.8 feet and weighing up to 1,100 lbs.

Our volunteers checked out a new stretch of Hobie Beach with us and walked away with 11 bags weighing in at 112 pounds, much of which was documented using Ocean Conservancy's Clean Swell app to keep a record of the different types of trash present on the site.

We are so proud of what our volunteers were able to accomplish despite a late start, and surprised at the varieties of pollution we saw at this site, which included sandals, shirts, and a large amount of glass fragments. We were even paid visits by a few animals like starfish, a stingray, and a cat!
